### Pastor's message

"There is nothing new under the sun." -Uplifting words from the ever optimistic teacher in Ecclesiastes. The larger quote reads like this:

"What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be done; there is nothing new under the sun. Is there a thing of which it is said,

"See, this is new"?

It has already been,

in the ages before us."

In this past year there have been many moments where these seemingly pessimistic words have given me an odd sense of comfort. We live in a time where we are pulled in many directions. Some promise progress, others wish for the good old days, and with every event and with every decision alarmists will raise the warning cry driving us all to places of fear and distrust. However, as the teacher from Ecclesiastes makes clear, none of these things are truly new. Yes, they may be wrapped with a slightly different ribbon, but the problems remain inherently simple and straightforward; greed, jealousy, hubris, and love of power. None of these things are new. But where the hope lies, is that which also remains the same; God's love, mercy, grace, and truth. If we read God's story, we find time and time again, moments where oppression and injustice is shattered through God's intervention. As consistent as sin is in our lives, God's forgiveness and reconciliation remains evermore. At the end of another year, we look into an uncertain future. It may be easy to look at the new problems we face as a society and a world and lose all sense of hope. But here is where the teacher's pessimistic realism may be our trumpeting cry. Nothing new is new enough in the eyes of the Almighty to change the will of God. Whatever comes our way, in the year ahead, as new or as different as it may appear, the root and the solution will be as it has been in ages past. Love will defeat hatred, truth with ring out facilities, and grudges will give way to grace.

As Christians, looking back on the Resurrection as the final sign to us that even in death God's constant love and hope reigns supreme, we rest assured that nothing can be done to change God's plan for us. Knowing that God's love wins, as we move into a new year, we can ask ourselves honestly, will we act as agents of this consistent change that God brings about, carrying the everlasting hope to a weary world, or will we follow the next "new" shiny thing that leads to distraction or destructions. Neither option is new nor will either option ever truly change. And while we contemplate our place and our decisions knowing ultimately that we will at times fail just as we have ages before, I am grateful that God gave us the promise of salvation before this choice, it tends to make the decision far easier.

Glory to God in the Highest, For God has done and will forever do great things for God's good creation!



#### Council Meeting Minutes - December 13, 2017 Following Advent Service - 7:45pm

Council Members attending the meeting included Pastor Aaron, Vice President Ron Foust, Secretary Jan Smith, Financial Secretary Lloyd Wortz, Trustee Mary Lou Teubert, Finance Committee members Matt Krull and Bobbi Kadrie, Education Board Rhianna Iverson, and visitor Kathy Young

#### **Council Business**

#### Pastor's Report:

- Pastor has made 4 communion visits and 1 hospital visit. He also led a service at St. Mary's in Winsted and attended a Task Force Luncheon, and the Crow River Conference monthly meeting. He and Pastor Al from Prairie Community Church planned and conducted the joint Thanksgiving service.
- The Crow River Conference Meeting will be held at Bethel on February 25 at 3:00pm.
- The next Crow River Monthly Meeting will be held March 13 and will focus on the topic of diversity.
- The conference goal for the Raise the Roof project was \$20,000. Currently a total of \$16,520 has been raised. However, it is expected that the goal will actually be reached when all donations are collected.
- Pastor received support for his request to purchase *Interpretation, New testament Series Set. a Bible Commentary for Teaching and Preaching* with funds from his continuing education budget.
- Pastor declared 2018 housing allowance at \$16,143.00.

#### **Approval of New Members**

A motion was made by Lloyd and seconded by Rhianna to approve Bob and Linda Haller, Katie Petersen and her children Luke and Max as members of the Bethel Lutheran Church. The motion carried.

#### Drainage project report/update - Tabled

#### **New Business**

- 1. Preliminary Budget Proposal The finance committee gave an update of their work on the budget for 2018.
- 2. Dick Kiekhaefer presented Endowment Fund resolution information.
- 3. Narthex Ceiling Deflection Crack A quote of \$6,249.12 has been proposed to repair the crack in the narthex ceiling.
- 4. Land west of the church The actual street repair on Lincoln Avenue will be in 2019-2020. A couple of open forum will be held in December and January.
- 5. The Proposed agenda for the Annual Meeting was examined. A motion was made by Lloyd and seconded by Bobbi that the ceiling repair in the narthex and a discussion about the land west of the church will be added to the annual meeting agenda. Motion carried.
- 6. A motion was made by Matt and seconded by Lloyd that Tamie be compensated for extra time spent between November 9 and December 10 learning the new computer system. The motion passed. This will be paid out of council expenses.

#### **Old Business**

- 1. Nominating Committee Update A motion was made by Lloyd and seconded by Mary Lou to present the nominating committee's proposed ballot at the annual meeting. The motion carried.
- 2. Annual Reports Due to Tamie as soon as possible.
- 3. Stewardship campaign Report The stewardship campaign in November went well.
- 4. Consent agenda approval of November business (resignation, secretary minutes, treasurer report, financial secretary report) Lloyd made a motion, seconded by Mary Lou to approve all November business reports due to the lack of a quorum at that meeting. Motion carried.

**Secretary Minutes of the November Meeting-** Motion made by Ron, seconded by Lloyd to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurer Report – Motion by Matt, seconded by Jan to approve the report. Motion carried.

**Financial Secretary Report** – Motion by Rhianna, seconded by Bobbi to approve the report. Motion carried.

#### Other Board Reports

- 1. Finance Budget
- 2. Education Practices are being held for the Sunday School Christmas Program. New Sunday School programs are being explored even though they have been very pleased with the current program.
- 3. Trustees Wayne Iverson requested to resign from the Trustee Board immediately. A motion was made by Rhianna, seconded by Lloyd to accept Wayne's resignation. Motion carried.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer and other prayer requests.
