Pastor's message

O taste and see that the Lord is good-Psalm 34:8a

Have you seen God recently? This ancient invitation from the Psalmist is most commonly heard on Sundays, spoken right before Holy Communion. It serves as a reminder to us, that Jesus Christ is present in the meal we are about to receive. However, the Psalmist's words were spoken centuries before Christ, and can also serve as an open invitation for us to experience our living Lord at any time and place. In other words, the invitation to experience God, which pours out from all corners of our Scripture, is not restricted to any specific time or place. The Bible itself is a collection of stories where individuals and people throughout history witnessed God's amazing activity in their lives. These witnesses speak of experiences with God that can be described through taste, smell, sight, sounds, time, temperature, and texture. Nevertheless, we often confine God's activity to these pages; black ink on white paper, and never expect to experience God anywhere else. What if we were to take the invitation to "taste and see" seriously?

What would it look like if we spent our daily lives, seeking a living active God; an embodied Christ who walks among us, the Holy Spirit who inspires, equips, and enlivens? The beauty of Holy Scripture is that in this witness, we are equipped and invited to see ourselves in the continued narrative of God's holy work. Therefore, we read the Bible, not simply to look back, but also to look out into the world and recognize the same God at work today. In other words, God's not done here, and familiarity with Scripture and God's activity in it helps us to taste and see this reality.

The Reformation itself was the result of Martin Luther's experiences with a living God. In his *Preface* to the Complete Edition of Luther's Latin Writings (1545), Luther describes a moment where the words of Scripture reached out to him in a new way and inspired him to see the world differently. About this "Tower Experience," Luther writes:

At last, by the mercy of God, meditating day and night, I gave heed to the context of the words, "In it the righteousness of God is revealed, as it is written, 'He who through faith is righteous shall live.'" There I began to understand that the righteousness of God is that by which the righteous lives by a gift of God, namely by faith. And this is the meaning; the righteousness of God is revealed by the gospel, namely, the passive righteousness with which merciful God justifies us by faith, as it is written, "He who through faith is righteous shall live." Here I felt that I was altogether born again and had entered paradise itself through open gates. There a totally other face of the entire Scripture showed itself to me....I also found in other terms an analogy, as, the work of God, that is, what God does in us, the power of God, with which he makes us strong, the wisdom of God, with which he makes us wise, the strength of God, the salvation of God, the glory of God.

The glory of God is truly all around us. So as we celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, let's not simply look back in our past. Instead, let us follow Luther's example and study Scripture, take up its invitation, and seek daily experiences of our living God.

Raise the Roof!



The Crow River Conference is working together to put a roof on the Bishop-stowe Circuit Center, a building [near Pietermaritzburg, South Africa], which has been designed to meet many of the needs of our partners in the Umgeni (pronounced Oom-gay'-nee) Circuit (the term South Africans use instead of conference.) The walls have been erected on the center and donations have been pledged to support the plumbing and electrical

work, finishing and inside fixtures. However, the roof has not been pledged and their project has halted. If every member of the Crow River Conference gave \$2, this great need could be met. \$20,000 is the goal needed to raise the roof. Can you help? October 2017: the 500th anniversary of the Reformation



"Out of love and zeal for truth and the desire to bring it to light, the following theses will be publicly discussed at Wittenberg under the chairmanship of Reverend Father Martin Luther, Master of Arts and Sacred Theology and regularly appointed Lecturer on these subjects at that place..."

These words begin *The Ninety-Five Theses*, a short document written by Luther to debate the Medieval Roman Catholic's use of indulgences. Legend has it that on October 31, 1517, Luther posted this document publicly on the door of Wittenberg's Castle Church, and it is this event which is commemorated as the beginning of the Reformation. This year we celebrate the 500th anniversary of this event, which changed the world. While Luther's words may have caused division, we still confess first and foremost one holy catholic and apostolic church, which can be found throughout all denominations, wherever the Gospel is shared and God is worshiped and

glorified. In our celebrations of our Lutheran heritage and identity this year, let us lift up the unifying message of God's unending grace, which cannot be bought, earned, or sold. And, may the God who makes things new, continue to inspire us to look forward with a love and zeal for truth and the desire to bring it to light. Happy Reformation!




When God Doesn't Fix It by Laura Story

Please, plan to stay after church to help with fall cleaning or sign up for a job to do at your convenience. "Many hands makes light work."





Opening Prayer– Pastor Aaron opened with an excerpt from Ending Your Day Right by Joyce Meyer **Council Business**

Pastor's Report:

- * Pastor attended the Crow River Conference Meeting. Two new members were welcomed leaving no pastoral openings in Crow River conference congregations.
- * First communion classes have been held and Sunday, September 17th will be First Communion Sunday.
- * The next Task Force lunch will be Oct. 18th at Bethel.
- * The Prairie Community and Harvest Community churches have been invited to join Bethel in a Thanksgiving service the Sunday evening before Thanksgiving.
- * Pastor will be attending a training program in mid-October and the Fall Theological Conference September 24-26. He will also be travelling with the National Lutheran Choir to Washington September 28-October 1st.
- * Four children from Bethel will be going to the Fall Frenzy at Green Lake Bible Camp September 29-30.

New Business

* School Banner – A motion was made by Wayne and seconded by Andria to have a Bethel Lutheran Church banner displayed in the Lester Prairie school gymnasium at a cost not to exceed \$500.00. The cost would be covered equally by the outreach and marketing budget.

- * Council nominations for 2018 Discussions will continue to raise awareness and clarify the responsibilities of council positions.
