# From the pastor's desk

Luke 21:29-31 Then [Jesus] told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near.

Siblings in Christ,

Looking back at the February 2020 newsletter, I was struck by how much my article spoke about normalcy and "ordinary" time and was an invitation to find God in the everyday parts of our lives. Little did we know what was soon on the horizon. I hesitate to look too far ahead, but this February, I am optimistic for the near future. With the Omicron wave steadily receding, vaccines for children under five nearing approval, and the general lengthening of sunlight in a day, finding signs of new life and hope is hard to ignore.

In this text, from the Gospel of Luke, Jesus is teaching the disciples about the "coming of the Son of Man"-essentially what we consider the end of time. Jesus' invitation to watch for the coming of sprouts before his more explicit call to be "on guard" and "be alert" so that our hearts are not heavy and that day does not come upon us unexpectedly. After the two years we have been through, I hear this text with new ears and see these invitations as a reason to always watch with hope, no matter how bleak the surroundings may seem. This is a gift of hope and empowerment to embrace change and seek the Kingdom.

Looking forward as we see signs of new life, we have every reason to know that summer is already near. Not in the sense of the end of all time (though that may be the case) but that God's grace makes all things new, and as we continue through this time and this place, we have that same expectation of readiness. A readiness to serve, to practice the faith so that our lights remain bright (trimmed and burning), and a readiness that prepares us for whatever new things are in store.

I hope you are feeling ready to engage in what may come in the new adventures and steadfast traditions that wait just on the horizon.

We consider the lilies, watch for fig sprouts, we rejoice in the harvest.


# Bethel Book Club

## <u>February</u>-Winter Garden by Kristin Hannah <u>Discussion: Wednesday, Feb, 16, 6:30 pm at church</u>



Mesmerizing from the first page to the last, Kristin Hannah's Winter Garden is one woman's sweeping, heartbreaking story of love, loss, and redemption. At once an epic love story set in World War II Russia and an intimate portrait of contemporary mothers and daughters poised at the crossroads of their lives, it explores the heartbreak of war, the cost of survival and the ultimate triumph of the human spirit. It is a novel that will haunt the reader long after the last page is turned.

## <u>March</u>-I Am Malala: The Girl Who Stood Up for Education and was Shot by the Taliban by Christina Lamb and Malala Yousafzai <u>Discussion: Wednesday, Mar. 16, at church following the Lenten service.</u>



"I come from a country that was created at midnight. When I almost died it was just after midday." When the Taliban took control of the Swat Valley in Pakistan, one girl spoke out. Malala Yousafzai refused to be silenced and fought for her right to an education. On Tuesday, October 9, 2012, when she was fifteen, she almost paid the ultimate price. She was shot in the head at point-blank range while riding the bus home from school, and few expected her to survive.

Instead, Malala's miraculous recovery has taken her on an extraordinary journey from a remote valley in northern Pakistan to the halls of the United Nations in New York. At sixteen, she became a global symbol of peaceful protest and the youngest nominee ever for the Nobel Peace Prize.

*I AM MALALA* is the remarkable tale of a family uprooted by global terrorism, of the fight for girls' education, of a father who, himself a school owner, championed and encouraged his daughter to write and attend school, and of brave parents who have a fierce love for their daughter in a society that prizes sons.

*I AM MALALA* will make you believe in the power of one person's voice to inspire change in the world.
