From the pastor's desk

"Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him."

Mark 16:6

Bethel Community,

The month of April brings with it the end of Lent and the start of the Easter season. Sometimes it appears strange to designate a specific time in the church year for such a celebration when, in fact, we declare the resurrection as often as we gather in worship. Having been born after the events of God's salvific work through the cross and empty tomb, we all live as Easter people in every moment of our lives. The Spirit of the Lord has been poured out upon all God's people; each can carry the Gospel on their tongues and hearts with each new day. Yet I think, the importance of this specific season set aside for us in the church year lies in the stunning reminder and sometimes a needed refresher of what we are celebrating and who we are worshiping.

During Lent, we repent and turn our eyes to God, looking for hope in God's forgiveness and praying for God's mercy. And in this next season, we hear the reply, "Do not be alarmed." We are met with resurrection and the promise of new life. In the face of so much change and a world of so many unknowns, it can be easy to lose focus or fall into confusion and despair. But that confusion and the feeling of lament most likely resemble the emotions and thoughts of the first witnesses to the empty tomb. The women approached with perfumes for a dead body, uncertain of what to do next. Yet they are met with an empty tomb and a risen Lord. The Gospel of Mark leaves the story at this crucial moment. A cliff-hanger.

What does the world look like when we know there is resurrection? What can the kingdom of God look like when new life is promised?

As change inevitably comes to a person, family, or community at large, there is loss. Some things are left behind or rolled away for the next steps to be taken. And while we may sometimes focus on the things left in the wake of change, the angel of the Lord calls us to look forward in hope, to run from the tomb with joy and good news, sharing the Gospel as we have before and as we always will.

The promise of the Resurrection can change all our calculations as we rest assured that nothing, not even death can dismantle the work of God, or disrupt the Gospel from finding willing feet and voices to carry the good news to neighbors and ourselves.

The open-ended, never-ending "ending" of the Gospel story that Easter morning greets us with each new day. What will we make of God's gift of grace today?

For all the moments I have, for any reason, caused confusion, harm, resentment, or pain, I pray to God for forgiveness and I ask for yours as well.

I do not worry about the future ministry of Bethel. You all have been church far before I got here (well before I was even born), and you will be church long after I'm gone. In some way or another as you remain vibrantly open to the Spirit, Bethel will continue to serve God and neighbors by joyfully living into the Good news of Jesus Christ. Praise be to God for the work that God has in store for you.

May God be with us all on these journeys of faith and forever united in Christ. May we continue to sing God's praises, serve God's creation, and seek God's kingdom in all we say and do.

It has been a blessing to be part of your lives, and may I never take this experience for granted.

This podcast has been a continuing education experience for me as they bring their vast theological knowledge and insights to the table in a very conversational approach. I strongly recommend it as a podcast simply for those wanted to deepen their faith and understanding of the world around them, and it is a perfect resource for our continued anti-racist efforts.







Board Reports:


- **Education:** The Education Board will be having a brainstorming session on Wednesday, March 16, 2022. Sunday School is continuing with SOLA curriculum.
