From the pastor's desk

Pentecost Come, Holy Spirit, Come

In St. John's gospel account, Jesus enters the place where his followers are staying, locked in a room and afraid. Jesus says to them, "Peace be with you." And then Jesus breathes on them. And when he does, they receive the Holy Spirit; they receive the power of God's breath.

Breathing – how unnoticeable it usually is. But, what does our breath have to do with God's breath? What is this breath of God's? And why did the followers need to receive it as they gathered in fear?

An English theologian, John Courtney Hall, described the Church as a conspiracy. That's because we breathe together. "Con" means "with," and "spire" means breathe. When we conspire, we breathe together. As Jesus breathes on his disciples locked in a room in Jerusalem, he makes them a conspiracy – he gives them the breath that holds them together. In God's breath, they share the experience of the grace Jesus gives. As Church, we breathe together as God's people, modeling a common way of life that is good for this world God so loves.

And people who breathe together can afford to be diverse. The Holy Spirit gives us all different gifts – given by the same God for the same purpose. People who breathe together can be diverse; we are *meant* to be diverse! The community of the Bible, the early Church, was very diverse, just as God intended. A community of resurrection faith cannot happen if we surround ourselves only with people who think, look, and act as we do.

The Day of Pentecost is on June 5th this year. In the reading appointed for that day, in Acts, it is the Jewish feast day of Pentecost in Jerusalem. The first community of believers – were the believing Jews. And they were as diverse a community as could be found in the world at that time. Let's look at who God draws together for this *conspiracy*: Galileans, Parthians, Medes, Elamites, Mesopotamians, Judeans, Cappadocians, those from Pontus, Asians, Phrygians, Pamphylians, Egyptians, Romans, Cretans, Arabs. This is the early congregation of believers, formed at Pentecost, and recorded in Acts. God's Church forms when people from all varieties of backgrounds enter the messiness of each other's lives. This is the way the Church, through God's Holy Spirit, transforms the world. That's because we have the *breath of God* breathed into us. We believe that the love generated by a community of faith is greater than the love we are capable of as individuals. That's because Jesus breathes the same *holy breath* into each of us.

This breath, this gift of the Holy Spirit, is given to us – at our baptism. We are sealed by the Holy Spirit; we are authentically God's. This cleansing bath of baptism – is also our *death* and our *resurrection* and our *rising to new birth*. In this new identity in Jesus, our faith life begins. And that life of faith is the work of the Holy Spirit. At our baptism we are welcomed by God's *conspiracy* – the congregation of Jesus Christ.

There is something else going on at this Pentecost recorded in Acts. The holy wind comes to a place where followers are gathered – and beyond the followers. Many from all lands are gathered. Peter is entrusted with the first proclamation of the Church; the message of the living God. And the first words of the Church's sermon: "We're not drunk! We're not filled with wine! We're on fire!" Jesus is kindling a fire in the community of the baptized. We do not have to do Jesus' work alone. The Holy Spirit opens our eyes through God's Word, and feeds us in God's meal. The Spirit enlivens us and gives us the gift of holy community, because God knows we need strength for the journey.

As you will hear on June 5th, through St. Luke's recording in Acts, Pentecost has a mark. It must have. What would have convinced Jewish believers that what they experienced was the very breath and fire of God? This: the community that was filled with the Holy Spirit looked around and said, "What do I have that you need?" Being filled with the Spirit, they gave of their love, their time, their vocation, their money, themselves. The mark of this new people formed by God was: "How much do we care about the people who need what God gave us?"

The breath and fire of God's Holy Spirit is God's way of saying, "I love you enough to suffer for you. I love you enough to overcome the power of death itself. Now, confront evil. Spread my saving Word to all. And, most of all, ask each other, "What do you need that I have?" Amen
