Supply Pastor's Message

Dear Children of God in Lester Prairie,

One of the amazing gifts God has given me is the ability to sit with people and listen to their stories. This gift is one of those gifts that continue giving as I learn about one of God's beloved children. A gift from God and one that I am honored to give. I work as a hospice chaplain for Knute Nelson Hospice. This gift gives me the ability to hold people as they are in that liminal space between life and death. Liminal space is a place of immense change and can be turbulent because of the emotional component of being in-between.

Liminal space is that in-between time. We live in that in-between time as Christians. We live in the liminal space between life on earth and life in God's kingdom. We have a foot in both realms as disciples of Christ. Because of this liminal space, God calls us to serve all of God's beloved children. By using the gifts that God gave us, we are gifting a glimpse of God's kingdom that we live in every day by the grace of our baptism. We have received so many wonderful gifts from God. Using these gifts is gratifying and brings joy to God, who gave us this gift.

We are in the season of liminal spaces. We are in between summer and fall-between school getting out and school starting. In this liminal time, what are some things that we can do to bring God's kingdom here to earth? In what ways are you using the gifts God gave you to serve God's beloved children?


