From the Vicar's desk

I find that November is something of a threshold month in the life of a church. Of course, here in the upper Midwest, November is the threshold of winter. As we shift out of daylight savings time, days begin to feel shorter, temperatures lower, and we anticipate when we might begin to be interrupted by the arrival of snow. It's the time for fall cleaning, winterizing, and making preparations for the cold season, whether that means waxing your skis or stockpiling hot cocoa for some good old hibernation and hygge.

As we each make preparations in this time of meteorological threshold, in our congregational life we have several upcoming Sundays in which we recall some important spiritual thresholds in our lives. With only a handful of weeks remaining in the Time after Pentecost, on Oct. 30th we will celebrate two of our students who are currently on the threshold of confirmation and church membership, and then on Nov. 6th, All Saints Sunday, we will remember the saints and loved ones who have crossed the threshold into the house of the God of grace before us.

November also places us on the threshold of Advent, and a new church year. I love that we will begin Advent at the end of November with Matthew's "Little Apocalypse" text. One reason being that, as something of a summer child, this time of year always feels a little bit like the end of the world to me. But also, I appreciate the chance to zoom out a bit at the beginning of the church year and recall that we live in a world of thresholds – of endings that always bring the promise of new beginning. And we know that even when the days get short and darkness more present, the Lord is our sun and shield, and a day in God's courts are better than a thousand we may have chosen.



This book can help. *Faith in Action* offers quick dives into a range of topics, from racial justice to environmental concerns, from LGBTQIA equality to Native people's rights, from women's equality to disability rights, from mass incarceration to immigration. Each topic includes informative visuals and data, as well as practical suggestions for what you can do to make a difference in your community.

December: Seven Aunts by Staci Lola Drouillard (12/21) Part memoir , part cultural history, these memories of seven aunts holding home and family together tell a crucial, often overlooked story of women in the twentieth century. In this multifaceted portrait, Drouillard summons ways of life largely lost to history , even as the possibilities created by these women live on. Unfolding against a personal view of the settler invasion of the Midwest by men who farmed and logged, fished and hunted, and mined, it reveals true heart and soul of that history: the lives of the women who held together family, home, and community women who defied expectations and overwhelming odds to make a place in the world for the next generation.
