May your eyes be opened to see the needs of our world.


And may you go to far-off places and bring acts of love.


January: Inside Out and Back Again



The meeting was called to order, and Vicar Stefan Swanson led us in prayer.

Council Business:

*A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Brian Duncan to accept the agenda as presented. Motion passed.

*Vicar Stefan gave his report for the last month. He is working on plans for upcoming Advent and Christmas services. Four new members were welcomed to the congregation.

Vicar attended a continuous growth session at Gustavus Adolphus. He visited Iris Rognli.

Old Business:

- 1) The Finance Board is continuing year-end consultations with employees.
- 2) Three disbursements have been made from the Covid Assistant Fund. A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Pete Hallberg to disburse the remaining amount of \$4350.00 as follows: 25% to the Pastor's Emergency fund; 25% towards camperships; and 50% to the Equipment Replacement Fund. Motion carried.

New Business:

- 1) A **motion** was made by Pete Hallberg and seconded by Peggy Wick to hold the Bethel Congregational Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 22, 2023, after worship. Motion carried.
- 2) The 2023 preliminary budget is in the process of being completed.

Secretary Minutes:

A **motion** was made by Ron Foust and seconded by Pete Hallberg to accept November's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:

A **motion** was made by Stacy Meyer and seconded by Pete Hallberg to accept November's treasurer's report. Motion carried. A **motion** was made by Ron Foust and seconded by Brian Duncan that money amounts in the checking account over \$10,000.00 should be transferred into general savings. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary Report:

A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Matt Krull to accept November's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

Reports:

1) Education Board:

Noisy offerings continue after worship on the last Sunday of each month. Sunday School continues. The children sang on November 11, 2022, during worship service. The Unhinged Pizza event was successful.

2) Finance Board:

Work continues on the budget and meeting with employees.

3) Trustees:

General maintenance needs have been completed. Brian Duncan led a discussion about replacing the old stove in the kitchen. The council encouraged the trustees to speak to the kitchen committee and to gather ideas, information, and numbers in guiding any recommendations to replace the large old stove. They should then bring the recommendations to the council.

Communications:

- 1) The members of the Congregational Mission Assessment/ Ministry Site Profile Committee are: Jean Hallberg, Jan Smith, Mary Lou Teubert, Emily Koehler, Lloyd Wortz, and Jeff Hanson. One youth member is also needed to serve on this committee.
- 2) The Executive Committee will review the Strategic Visioning Document after the Jan. 9, 2023, meeting.
- 3) Annual Reports are due to Tamie Foust by Dec. 15, 2022. Financial reports are due by Jan. 5, 2023.
- 4) Vicar Swanson continues to research stewardship programs.
- 5) The nominating committee is in the process of finding members to fill open positions.

The meeting closed with Round Table Prayers and the Lord's Prayer.

The next regular Council meeting will be held on Monday, January 9, 2023, at 6:30 p.m.
