Well I'll admit I didn't anticipate giving up Ash Wednesday for Lent. By the time this is published, I imagine folks will be shoveled out and the sun might even be shining again. And even without a chance to gather and have ashes imposed on our foreheads, it is never too late to remind ourselves that our God has lovingly formed us as good creations out of dust, and that one day we each will return to dust. Of course, Ash Wednesday is also an opportunity to remember our baptism, and that even in the midst of remembering the inevitability of death, we rejoice in the promise of new life and resurrection in Christ. And so as we begin this season of Lent, we adopt a spirit of repentance and ask our crucified and resurrected God to create within us clean hearts and new spirits.

I'd like to invite you to spend some time with Bethel over the 40 day journey of Lent. We'll be having Lenten meals at 5:15 pm every Wednesday in March, followed by a midweek service at 6:30 pm in the style of Taizé (an ecumenical Christian community in France). These services use simple, repetitive songs, visuals, scripture readings, and hold space for meditation. Whatever path you find yourself on during this Lenten journey, I hope you'll consider Bethel as a stop along the way.

The McLeod Emergency Food Shelf is making preparation for the 2023 MN Foodshare March Campaign, and they need your help in making this a successful campaign!



Call to Order and Opening Prayer:

The meeting was called to order by Vice President, Peg Wick. Vicar Swanson led us in prayer.

Council Business:

*A motion was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Mitch Overbye to accept the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

*Vicar Stefan Swanson reported that the Mission Assessment Team has been meeting and facilitated a potluck on Sunday, February 5, 2023, with 50-60 in attendance.
