From the Vicar's desk

Psalm 145:8-9 (translation Robert Alter)

Gracious and merciful is the LORD, slow to anger, great in kindness. Good is the LORD to all, and His mercy is over all His creatures.

One of my own pet personal paradoxes is that, as someone who was mostly raised in Minnesota, I have never been a big fan of the winter or the cold. Whether this is due to a failure to adapt, or a lack of resilience, or a lingering impact of having spent my first two years of life in sunny, southern Florida, I'm not sure. I do know that as I write this newsletter on the summer solstice, with sun, warmth, and days that last well into the 9 o'clock hour, I find myself in disbelief at the difference between now and February. The summer seems gratuitously beautiful to me (excepting the drought and air pollution, to be sure). The days are almost so nice that it's hard to believe this season is really, finally here.

Sometimes verses like those from Psalm 145, which we'll hear in worship on July 9th, can seem awfully gratuitous to me as well. Good is the Lord to ALL – His mercy is over ALL His creatures. Really? God is good to everyone? God's mercy is for all? And yet our scriptures show us again and again that God's grace IS gratuitous – given freely, given broadly, and for all of God's creatures. It so deep and wide that maybe sometimes it's even hard to grasp or accept.

As I continue pondering the theme from this year's Southwestern Minnesota Synod Assembly – "Embody the Word," this week I'm wondering what it would be like to really embody this kindness, mercy, and grace of God. What if, like feeling the warmth of a sunbeam on our skin in the long, dazzling days of June, we learned to feel the mercy and grace of God in our bodies? How might this change how we bring God's Word out into the world – how we embody the Word? What does God's grace feel like for your body?

I'd like to take a moment to thank the Mission Assessment Committee, who have been working hard in the past several weeks to assemble Bethel's "ministry site profile" – the paperwork used by the synod to present Bethel to potential candidates for a pastoral call. This team has been working together since January, embodying God's word in faithful service to this church, doing some outstanding work. Thanks also to those who have volunteered to serve on the call committee in the coming months– your willingness to take on this important role is so appreciated.

Finally, however each of us are embodying God's word this summer, I pray that we'll experience the gratuitous kindness and mercy of God, and share it with everyone around us.

July: The Measure by Nikki Erlick

Enchanting and deeply uplifting, *The Measure* is a sweeping, ambitious, and invigorating story about family, friendship, hope, and destiny that encourages us to live life to the fullest.

August: United States of Grace by Lenny Duncan

Lenny Duncan brings us a deeply personal story about growing up Black and queer in the U.S. In his characteristically



Black and queer in the U.S. In his characteristically powerful voice he recounts hitchhiking across the country, spending time in solitary confinement, battling for sobriety, and discovering a deep faith, examining pressing issues like poverty, mass incarceration, white supremacy, and LGBTQ inclusion through an intimate portrayal of his life's struggles and joys. United States of Grace is a love story about America, revealing the joy and resilience of those places in this country many call "the margins" but that Lenny Duncan has called home. This book

makes the bold claim that God is present with us in the most difficult of circumstances, bringing life out of death.

Bethel Lutheran Church-Council Meeting Minutes-Monday, June 12, 2023

Council Members Present: President: Ron Foust; Secretary: Cathy Houg; Treasurer: Matt Krull; Financial Secretary: Stacy Meyer; Finance Board: Mitch Overbye and Sara Jepsen; Education Board: Pete Hallberg and Emily Koehler; Trustee Board: Bryon Weisenburger; Vicar Stefan Swanson Guests from MSP Committee: Jeff Hanson, Lloyd Wortz, Jan Smith, and Mary Lou Teubert **Special Guest:** Pastor Naomi Mahler, Synod office consultant **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by President Ron Foust at 6:30 p.m. Vicar Swanson opened the meeting with prayer.

Council Business:

- 1) A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Pete Hallberg to accept the agenda as presented. Motion carried.
- 2) Vicar Swanson reported that, in the last month, the final report of the Mission Assessment/Ministry Site Profile Committee was presented (May 21,2023). Three-fourths of the confirmation interviews have been completed. Worship at the Bergen site was well attended and a success. A baptism was celebrated for Eleanor Merlin Govig. Vicar attended both the SW MN Synod Assembly and a first-call meeting. Pete Hallberg and Jan Smith also attended the Synod Assembly. Vicar Stefan is working with the Education Committee to find Vacation Bible School material.

Old Business:

- 1) There is no progress yet on the Audit Committee job description.
- 2) The Mission Assessment/Site Profile Committee shared that the Mission Site Profile (MSP) has been entered into the Synod web site less some names/contact information, and budget/salary range information. The committee will be meeting on June 19, 2023, to finalize the MSP with added information. The final MSP will become available on the Synod website enabling pastoral candidates, interested in serving at Bethel, an opportunity to review the document. This process will enhance and enable the Call Committee to begin the interviewing process.

STEPS: *MSP to be finalized, entered in the Synod website by Wednesday, June 21, 2023.

*Council will review the final MSP and vote on approval by Monday, June 28, 2023.

*Council to review the Call Committee members and vote to approve them by July 1, 2023.

*Pastor Naomi Mahler wiil meet with the Call Committee after July 1, 2023, to begin laying out the strategy/interviewing process.

New Business:

- 1) A **motion** was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Pete Hallberg to accept the following people into church membership: David Gohl, Janice Gohl, Katlin Fosdick, Katie Radtke, John Staub, Alayna Staub. Motion carried.
- 2) Eight confirmed members are needed for the Call Committee: 3 from the Church Council, 3 from the church at large, 1 from WELCA, and 1 youth. Pastor Naomi Mahler from the Synod office discussed the process of calling a new pastor which included providing prospective candidates a copy of our completed Mission Site Profile, solidifying a list of questions to be answered by the candidates, and holding interviews: one-on-one and by ZOOM. She is available whenever she is needed as a support person during this process.
- Secretary Minutes: A motion was made by Ron Foust and seconded by Mitch Overbye to accept May's secretary's report. Motion carried.
- Treasurer Reports: A motion was made by Bryon Weisenburger and seconded by Pete Hallberg to accept May's treasurer's report. Motion carried.
- Financial Secretary Report: A motion was made by Mitch Overbye and seconded by Sara Jepsen to accept May's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

Reports:

- 1) Education Board: Intergenerational Vacation Bible School will be held August 14-17, 2023.
- 2) **Finance Board:** The Finance Board is reviewing the office equipment contract.

3) **Trustees:** The trustees are investigating options for sandblasting and repainting the cross/bell tower. **Communications:**

- 1) Kingdom Roofing is in contact with our insurance company regarding roof and siding repair.
- 2) The new organ will be installed on Friday, June 16, 2023.
- 3) Pastor Donna has been contacted as a supply pastor for August 6, and August 20.
- The meeting closed with Round Table Prayers and the Lord's Prayer.

The next regular Council meeting will be held on Monday, July 10, 2023, at 6:30 p.m.
