FROM PASTOR SUSAN ENGHOLM

"Love the Lord Your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind..."

As I wrote in last month's newsletter, each month I am introducing a prayer practice for you to consider and try out. Last month, we learned that by focusing on deep breathing, we are reminded that God's Spirit is as near to us as our own breath, which becomes a kind of prayer. This month, we focus on *Lectio Divina*.

Lectio Divina, Latin for "Sacred Reading," is a practice of reading the Bible slowly and deliberately to shape a time of personal prayer. Lectio Divina was originally described by St. Benedict in the 6th century, using four practices: *lectio* (reading), *meditatio* (meditation), *oratio* (prayer), and *contaplatio* (contemplation). While many people choose to practice Lectio Divina alone, you can also share in the practice with others.

When we practice Lectio Divina, it might look something like this:

- 1) Choose a Bible passage in which you would like to spend some time. I have included a scripture from Matthew below to get you started. (Or save your bulletin from Sunday! You could use one of the scriptures printed on back.)
- 2) Prepare your heart and space. Find a quiet place and a comfortable chair. Perhaps say a short prayer to begin your time.
- 3) **READ:** Slowly read the scripture passage you have chosen. Listen for a word, phrase, or image that captures your attention.
- 4) **MEDITATE:** Read the scripture a second time, this time noticing how the word, phrase, or image brings the passage to light in a new way. Allow your imagination to notice how this word, phrase, or image shapes how you hear it.
- 5) **PRAY:** As you read the scripture a third time, this time let it be an entrance into prayer. What does this scripture raise up in you? Does it create questions? Does it speak to things you hold in your heart? Offer all these things to God in prayer.
- 6) **CONTEMPLATE:** Finally, release all the images, questions, and thoughts you have been holding and read the scripture a fourth time. Consider the gift God as given to you in this time. Where is God calling you to be? Who is God calling you to serve?

Many blessings as you seek ways to deepen your relationship to God. Let me know how this practice goes for you!


3. Bethel offering envelope

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 by President Ron Foust followed by a prayer led by Pastor Engholm.

Council Business:

- * A **motion** was made by Pete Hallberg and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to approve the agenda as amended to include one more communication item. Motion carried.
- * Pastor Engholm reported that confirmation will be held on October 29, 2023, Reformation Sunday. She will be attending the upcoming Youth Task Force meeting. She presided over the reinterment of Verona Howell. She also visited Pastor Naomi Mahler and was updated on the Counselorship for Green Lake Bible Camp. She discussed with Council the process of updating the congregational membership records. The Executive Board will assist with this process following November's Church Council meeting.

Old Business:

* A **motion** was made by Peg Wick and seconded by Stacy Meyer to accept the job description for the Audit Committee as completed by the Finance Board. Motion carried.

New Business:

* Lloyd Wortz presented information on the recently updated bylaws of the Endowment Committee. At the next meeting, November 13, 2023, the Church Council will provide feedback on any concerns followed by a vote to accept. A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Nancy Krull to have a second passing of the plate during worship on October 29, 2023. This offering will go to the Endowment Fund. Motion carried.

Secretary Minutes:

A **motion** was made by Pete Hallberg and seconded by Mitch Overbye to accept September's secretary's report with a correction that the funeral for Alan Stern was on August 30, 2023, with burial in September 2023. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:

A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Mitch Overbye to accept September's treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary Report:

A **motion** was made by Nancy Krull and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to accept September's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

The Board is researching various stewardship programs for the beginning of 2024. They are also working with three companies on insurance options.

Trustees:

The roof and siding will be completed by the end of the month. A new-to-us pastor's desk has been purchased and is now in the pastor's office. Items no longer needed include two speakers used with the old organ, two gas burners (\$10 each), an L-shaped black computer desk with a hutch and a bookshelf (\$30), and two gold office chairs. Anyone interested should speak to Bryon Weisenburger. The Trustees will replace the batteries in the AED unit and check the electrodes.

- *Rev. William Nelson will lead worship on November 12, 2023.
- *Dr. Dee Pederson will celebrate her 2-year anniversary as SWMN Synod Bishop.
- *The Nominating Committee will be activated.
- *The congregational meeting for 09-17-2023 was cancelled. The Call Committee is once again activated.
- *Adult Forum will begin in November from 10:20-11:00 following worship service. (There will not be Adult Forum on the last Sunday of the month due to Bethel Breakfast.) The focus will be: Frequently Asked Questions about being Lutheran.

The meeting closed with Round Table Prayers and the Lord's Prayer.
