FROM PASTOR SUSAN ENGHOLM

Dear Siblings in Christ,

During the season of Advent and Christmas, we often become attuned to the needs of others. We share our generosity by donating to causes and special drives. We purchase gifts for our loved ones for Christmas. We become more aware of those who go with less.

With the spirit of generosity towards neighbor in mind, a prayer practice that can be fruitful in this Advent season is something called the "Lovingkindness Meditation." Originally rooted in Buddhism, it is a prayer practice that turns our hearts towards our neighbor. (Christians have borrowed from many traditions. The rosary was also borrowed from Buddhism!) In John 15:12, Jesus said, "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." This mediation helps us cultivate the kind of love and compassion that Jesus invites us to have for ourselves, our loved ones, our neighbors, our enemies, and the entire world.

First, let your body rest and be relaxed. Feel your breath going in and out of your body. After each petition, you are invited to say this simple prayer:

May I/you/they be filled with lovingkindness.

May I/you/they be safe from inner and outer dangers.

May I/you/they be well in body and mind.

May I/you/they be at ease and happy.

- 1. **Begin with yourself**. Without loving yourself it is almost impossible to love others. Breathe gently and recite the above prayer.
- **2. Think of a person who has been loving and kind to you**. Perhaps it is a caregiver or a close friend or partner. Think of someone who helps you feel safe and at ease. Picture this person and recite the prayer.
- **3.** Recall a person toward whom your feelings are neutral. Maybe it is the grocery store clerk you saw today, or your mail carrier, or a coworker you don't know well. Think of this person and recite the same prayer.
- **4. Turn your mind now to someone who has hurt you in the past.** Without feeling the need to condone or approve of their actions, you are invited simply to see them as a human being who has the same need to be loved as you do. Recite the phrases toward this person.
- 5. Now, imagine your neighborhood, your town, the Twin Cities Metro, and beyond. Picture all of the countless beings in this world. Again, recite the prayer.
- **6. Finally, focus once again on yourself** so the feeling of loving-kindness fills you completely; breathing in peacefully, breathing out peacefully; at peace with yourself and the world.

Jesus preached a radical kind of love that guides us to pray for our neighbors and even for our enemies. May this practice cultivate the love of Christ in you during this season of Advent!


3. Bethel offering envelope

Council Members Present: President: Ron Foust; Vice President: Peggy Wick; Secretary: Cathy Houg; Treasurer: Matt Krull; Financial Secretary: Stacy Meyer; Finance Board: Mitch Overbye; Education Board: Pete Hallberg and Emily Koehler; Trustee Board: Brian Duncan; Interim Pastor Susan Engholm

Guests: Lloyd Wortz, Endowment Committee and Jean Hallberg, Call Committee

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 by President Ron Foust followed by a prayer led by Pastor Engholm.

Council Business:

- A motion was made by Mitch Overbye and seconded by Cathy Houg to approve the agenda as presented.
 Motion carried.
- Pastor Engholm reported that she made six visits this month. She attended the October Youth Task social and planning meeting. Bethel will host the youth event in January.
- Four confirmands celebrated Confirmation on October 29, 2023. Monday morning Bible Study has restarted.

Old Business:

A review and discussion of the updated Endowment bylaws was led by Lloyd Wortz. A motion was made by Pete Hallberg
and seconded by Peggy Wick to accept the bylaws as presented. Motion carried. Final acceptance and approval of the
bylaws will be at the congregational annual meeting in January, 2024.

New Business:

- A motion was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Pete Hallberg to pay up to \$90 for registrations to the Equipping Congregations Conference. Motion carried. The conference will be held on December 2, 2023, at Vinje Lutheran Church, Willmar.
- A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Brian Duncan to pay \$250 for Lester Prairie gift cards to be given to the five employees as holiday gifts. Motion carried.
- The Finance Board will begin employee year-end consultations.
- The Finance Board is working on the 2024 preliminary Church budget. They will present at the December Council meeting.
- A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Mitch Overbye to hold the Congregational Annual Meeting on January 28, 2024. Motion carried.
- Jean Hallberg presented the pastoral candidate of choice by the Call Committee.
- A **motion** was made by Stacy Meyer and seconded by Emily Koehler to accept the Call Committee's recommendation, to present Molly Wills to the congregation as our candidate for call to the pastorship of Bethel Lutheran Church, and to extend to her a call at two-thirds time. Motion carried. The congregational meeting will be held on December 3, 2023, following worship for the purpose of the call vote.

Secretary Minutes:

A **motion** was made by Pete Hallberg and seconded by Emily Koehler to accept October's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:

A **motion** was made by Mitch Overbye and seconded by Pete Hallberg to accept October's treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary Report:

A **motion** was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Cathy Houg to accept October's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

Reports:

Education Board: Confirmation was held on Reformation Sunday. Adult Forum has begun. The Sunday School Christmas Program will be held on Sunday December 17, 2023, during worship.

Finance Board: The Finance Board has recommended the church's insurance be covered by American Church Group with a quote of \$7,922 per year. Coverage will be nearly the same as current coverage. The Finance Board is reviewing the Church's misconduct policy. Background checks are required on all adults who come in contact with children. The Education Board and Tamie Foust will manage this policy and background check compliance.

Trustees: A snowplowing contract has been given to Litzau Excavating. The siding and roof have been completed. The remaining electrical work will be completed this week. Some nails have poked through the ceiling in the sanctuary. Kingdom Builders has graciously said they are willing to do the work-repair, patch, and repaint using Bethel's paint. The cross is now in place. The Trustees will look into cleaning the carpet, especially in the Sunday School room, as recommended.

Communications:

- The Nominating Committee will be activated with openings available for Council, Committees, and Boards.
- Bishop Elizabeth Eaton is taking a leave of absence. Rev. Michael Burk will serve as Bishop Pro Tem.
- Annual Meeting Reports are due to Tamie Foust by Dec. 15, 2023, and Financial Reports by January 10, 2024.
- Endowment Grant Proposals are due by November 30, 2023, with proposal presentations at the January 2024 Congregational Meeting.

The meeting closed with Round Table Prayers and the Lord's Prayer.

The next regular Council meeting will be held on Monday, December 11, 2023, at 6:30 p.m.
