FROM PASTOR SUSAN ENGHOLM

"Jacob set up a pillar in the place where he had spoken with him, a pillar of stone; and he poured out a drink offering on it, and poured oil on it. So Jacob called the place where God had spoken with him Bethel." Genesis 35:14-15



Genesis tells about the time when God gave Jacob the new name, "Israel." To mark the occasion, Jacob/Israel piled stones upon each other to make a pillar and then named the place "Bethel," or "House of God." Stone pillars (sometimes called a "cairn") have been used across generations and cultures. Sometimes the purpose is as simple as a trail marker and other times (as it was in Genesis) its purpose was to mark a significant occasion. No matter the specific use, these stone pillars also signify a kind of gratitude: Gratitude for those who set the trail ahead, gratitude for those who follow, gratitude for God's presence and active hand in our lives.

In this final newsletter article to you, I offer one last prayer practice: Gratitude. When we focus on gratitude, our attention, curiosity, and imagination become more attuned to God's goodness. One way you could try practicing gratitude is by writing it down: at the start – or end – of each day, write down three things for which you are grateful. As you begin the practice, you may feel like you are writing the same things each day. But, with time, you will begin to see more and more things for which to be grateful. Our hearts and minds tune into God's goodness that surrounds us each day.

I am so very grateful for you! I began my time with you in September, thinking that within a matter of weeks I would be on my way. But now, these four months later, I have been embraced by this dear faith community. I am grateful for the ways you have personally welcomed me into your midst and ministry. I am also grateful for the ways you live up to the meaning of your name, "Bethel." You truly are the "house of God," and each one of you radiates the light of Christ. It has been humbling to witness how you live this out in your daily lives and as a community.

As we part ways, I offer my blessings and prayers to you as you continue your ministry together as a congregation, and especially as you welcome and support your new pastor. May you always experience the "blessing to be a blessing" unto others. As we part ways, I offer the same prayer I shared as we began this journey together. May the words be a blessing unto the path ahead:

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.


3. Bethel offering envelope

Call to Order:

• The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by President Ron Foust followed by prayer led by Pastor Engholm.

Council Business:

- A motion was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Nancy Krull to approve the agenda as presented.
 Motion carried.
- Pastor Engholm reported that she made three communion visits this month. Monday Morning Bible Study continues. Thanksgiving Eve Service was held followed by a pie reception sponsored by WELCA. Midweek Advent services have started with a new lliturgy. The fall session of confirmation has concluded and will resume on February 4, 2024, after the new pastor arrives. Pastor Susan's last Sunday is December 31, 2023.

Old Business:

New Business:

- A **motion** was made by Nancy Krull and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to accept the Helland family-Tyler, Terri, McCoy, Adderley, and Etta as new members. Motion carried.
- The Finance Board has begun employee year-end consultations.
- The Finance Board has begun developing the 2024 preliminary Church Budget.
- Staff transitions include the following: Pastor Susan will serve as interim Pastor through December 31, 2023, and will be available for emergencies until Pastor Molly Wills begins on January 24, 2024. Pastor Susan will also attend and help facilitate the Youth Task event at Bethel on Wednesday, January 10, 2024. Pastor Donna Olsen will provide pulpit supply on January 7, 2024. Pastor William Nelsen will provide pulpit supply on January 14 and 21, 2024. Pastor Molly Wills will begin serving on Wednesday, January 24, 2024. A **motion** was made by Matt Krull and seconded by Cathy Houg to approved a base salary of \$53,325.63 for Pastor Wills. Motion carried. The Installation Service for Molly Wills will be on January 28, 2024, with Pastor Heather Culuris, Synod staff, officiating followed by Bethel's Annual Meeting. A **motion** was made by Matt Krull and seconded by Stacy Meyer to have a meal catered by Longhorn's after the Annual Meeting. Motion carried.

 A motion was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Nancy Krull to accept November's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:
