Music Notes

The choir anthem "Sim Shalom", which will be sung by the Bethel Choir on March 10, was written by Jennaya Robinson, Artistic Director of the National Lutheran Choir and church musician at the First Lutheran Church in Mission Hills, Kansas. This song is a prayer for peace and is sung by the choir using the Hebrew text. The English translation is: "Grant peace, goodness, and blessing to us and unto Israel, your people." The composer hoped that this melody would be one that singers and listeners could carry with them into their daily lives.

Ten members of the Bethel choir recently attended a Choral Tune-Up in Roseville, conducted by Jennaya Robinson. It was an opportunity to learn new music for worship under her direction with approximately 300 vocalists. This included members of the National Lutheran Choir and choir members from churches across the region. The group studied four pieces of music that could be used in a worship setting throughout the year. Three out of the four composers of the songs were in attendance that day.

The Bethel Choir will share other choral pieces learned at the Tune-Up in the future. (By the way, Pastor Aaron is a member of the NLC and was eager to send greetings to Bethel!)


3. <u>Bethel offering envelope</u>

Call to Order:

• The meeting was called to order at 6:00 by Vice President Peggy Wick followed by a prayer led by Pastor Molly Wills.

Council Business:

- A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Mitch Overbye to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.
- Pastor Wills reported that since she began, she has attended a first-call retreat and visited two home bound members. Confirmation has restarted. She requested that the Council members consider volunteering to share a faith statement for Wednesday Lenten services.

Old Business:

The Finance Board has completed employee year-end consultations.

New Business:

- Vice President Wick welcomed newly elected Council Members: Peggy Wick, Jill Duncan, Sara Jepsen, Mitch Overbye, Pete Hallberg, and Dave Gohl. She also welcomed Pastor Molly Wills to the Council.
- The Audit Committee (Carol Wortz, Jenna Pariseau, and Jeremy Radtke) have completed the 2023 review.
- A **motion** was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Emily Koehler to change the Church Council meeting start time to 6:00 p.m. Motion carried.
- The Council was asked to begin thinking about options for a Stewardship Campaign. Discussion followed.

Secretary Minutes:

A **motion** was made by Stacy Meyer and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to accept January's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:

A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Pete Hallberg to accept January's treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary Report:

A **motion** was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Sara Jepsen to accept January's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

Reports:

Education Board: Pete Hallberg has been taking the lead on updating the Child and Youth Protection Policy. He will be working with Tamie Foust and Pastor Molly.

Finance Board: The 2024 Budget was approved at the Congregational Annual Meeting. Mitch Overbye and the Trustees will be looking at live-stream options for our worship services to correct streaming problems that occur. The Finance Board will be examining the Earned Sick and Safe Time Law and its implications for Bethel.

Trustees: The old church laptop computer has been recycled. Fire Service Inspections will be conducted monthly as required. The Trustees will be working with the WELCA group to replace the kitchen stove. There was concern that last year a few new people missed Easter Sunday service because they were unaware of the 8:00 a.m. start time. Options to correct this problem were discussed. A **motion** was made by Stacy Meyer and seconded by Sara Jepsen to begin Easter Sunday worship service at **9:00 a.m.** followed by Easter Brunch. Motion carried.

Communications:

- Pastor Molly will be on vacation Apr.2 –7, 2024. Pastor Bill Nelsen will provide pulpit supply on Sun., Apr. 7.
- Lenten Services begin on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024.
- It is time to purge the Council's three-ring binders. Reports from the last 2-3 years should be kept.
- The sign up sheet for Easter Brunch food items will be available to Council members at the March meeting. Ron Foust will chair the serving of this event.
- WELCA will be sending a representative to the monthly Church Council meetings.
- Vice President Peggy Wick shared a thank you to the members of the Call Committee: Jean Hallberg, Stacy Meyer, Peggy Wick, Cathy Houg, Conner Meyer, Max Peterson, LuAnn Weisenburger, Jan Smith, and Julie Hanson.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer at 7:19 p.m.

The next regular Council meeting will be held on Monday, March 11, 2024, at 6:00 p.m.
