FROM PASTOR MOLLY

Hello beloved Bethel members!

Since I got to ask some of you hard questions over this past Lenten season, I thought I would answer those questions for you all to learn more about me over the next months' newsletters. As you read the questions and my answers I encourage you to think about those questions yourself, and maybe next Lent you'd be willing to be interviewed.

Who is God to you?

When I was little, God was my imaginary friend that was real. I grew up in the country, in an underground hill house (looked kind of like a Hobbit house), and I'd go outside to sing to, talk with, and play with God. I'd stand on top of our roof which stood above the treetops and listen to the wind blowing through the leaves of the hundreds of Ash trees my dad planted all over our acreage. The wind was the Holy Spirit playing and singing to me.

Now that I'm grown, I still love to go outside, working in my garden and yard, talking to God and listening to the Spirit move across the earth. God has always been with me. God is my friend, my sibling, my mom, my dad, and my spouse depending on the day and my need in that moment.

How do you connect with God outside of church?

I essentially answered this question in the above answer. And since I tend to feel closest to God outside, I'll alter the question a little – how does church help me connect with God? Though being outside is where I feel closest to God, church is where I go to feel connected to a larger body. During Covid it was incredibly hard to be separated from church. I am an introvert and could easily become a hermit given the opportunity <grin>, but for the sake of my relationship with God, I need to go to church. It fills me spiritually to be with other people also in relationship with God, to be able to have deep conversations about how God is at work in our lives, or maybe doesn't always seem to be present in our lives, to be able to wonder together knowing there are no concrete answers to our questions, but we can still ponder and find hope in our wondering. When I lead a service I am just another member of the congregation, participating in the joy-filled worship of God, thinking about how I have seen God in each of you, seen God's love poured out into the world, and felt it poured out onto me.

How do you find rest in the midst of your everyday life?

This is a harder question because I always feel the need to be busy. So, when I find moment of rest like sitting on the couch for a while reading a fun book, I end up feeling guilty knowing there are things that need to be done and so I quit reading. I have never been good at doing daily devotions or reading the Bible daily. It ends up just feeling like a chore that I have to remember rather than it being what it is meant to be – spiritually filling. But something I have found that I can do each week that being a pastor has allowed me to focus on, is my Spirit Art. Sitting and drawing or painting and thinking about the scripture text for the upcoming service gives me a moment of calm and peace in the midst of my busy weeks. This spring has felt particularly crazy with starting a new job, testing for my black belt in karate (which my final exam is April 20th!), and in general the normal life stuff of having three active children, a busy husband, a house and yard to care for, etc. I guess after answering this question I clearly need to work on finding more moments of rest in my everyday life <grin>.




3. Bethel offering envelope

Council Members Present: President: Ron Foust; Secretary: Cathy Houg; Treasurer: Jill Duncan; Financial Secretary: Stacy Meyer; Finance Board: Mitch Overbye; Education Board: Emily Koehler; Trustee Board: Bryon Weisenburger; Pastor Molly Wills

Call to Order:

• The meeting was called to order at 6:00 by President Ron Foust followed by a prayer led by Pastor Wills.

Council Business:

- A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.
- Pastor Wills reported that she has visited homebound members in the last month. She attended the Youth Task Force meeting and social event this month. Lenten Services continue. First Communion will be on April 14, 2024, with three Bethel youth participating.

Old Business:

There was no old business.

New Business:

- A **motion** was made by Mitch Overbye and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to allocate the Easter Brunch proceeds to McLeod Food Shelf. Motion carried. Easter Brunch will be held at 10:00 following worship. The Council signed up for food contributions.
- Pastor passed out articles for the Council to read regarding a stewardship campaign.
- A **motion** was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Mitch Overbye to add Nicole Weisenburger to the Audit Committee for a 3-year term. Motion carried.
- Mitch Overbye reported that Resplandor de Gloria wishes to extend their annual agreement with Bethel; however, they would like to change their worship day from Saturday evening to Sunday evening. Since Bethel already has Sunday evening events scheduled, Mitch will talk to them about time flexibility/options.
- A **motion** was made by Bryon Weisenburger and seconded by Jill Duncan to purchase an advertisement in the 2024 Easter Special Church Section of the Herald Journal (all five of their newspapers) telling about our Easter services. The 2" X 3" advertisement is \$109. Motion carried.

Secretary Minutes:

A **motion** was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Stacy Meyer to accept February's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:

A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Mitch Overbye to accept February's treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary Report:

A **motion** was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Cathy Houg to accept February's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

Reports:

Education Board:

Confirmation has restarted. Bibles have been ordered to present to the third graders.

Finance Board:

A motion was made by Ron Foust and seconded by Cathy Houg to keep approximately \$10,000 in the checking account, to keep approximately \$15,000 in the savings account, and to put the balance into two or three \$10,000 6-month CD's. Motion carried.

Trustees:

The Trustees have received two estimates for painting the bell tower. They are also checking to see if a local painter is interested in submitting a bid. They are contacting sound system professionals to find someone to correct streaming issues (crackling) coming from the electric piano. The Trustees are also working to dispose of items in the garage that are not used or needed.

Communications:

- Pastor Molly will be on vacation April 2nd through April 7th. Pastor Bill Nelsen will be providing pulpit supply on April 7, 2024.
- Lori Dolezal, our custodian, will be retiring at the end of 2024. Trustees are considering options. The meeting closed with Round Table Prayers and the Lord's Prayer.

The next regular Council meeting will be held on Monday, April 8, 2024, at 6:00 p.m.
