FROM PASTOR MOLLY

Hello beloved Bethel members!

Again, I continue the saga of questions and answers. Remember, as you read, I encourage you to think about these questions yourself!

When you feel hopeless, do you have anything specific you do to help?

In these moments, what helps me is to write either in my journal or to write poetry. When I journal, it is always a letter to God, talking about the day, the week, the month, the year, and all my feelings, the pains, sorrows, and frustrations that are pent up inside and need to be released. I don't hold anything back because God can take it all. When I write poetry, it is more introspective, focusing on describing what is happening inside me, using imagery to give what I am feeling a life and story of its own that is separate from me, but still speaks to me.

Where do you find hope in your life?

I find hope by looking at the silver linings. When things feel incredibly horrible, and I find myself spiraling farther and farther down, after a good cry I will write, and as I do I inevitably find the silver linings, the glimmers of hope that help me push through the rough patch. Sometimes the silver linings are incredibly small things, like maybe I accidentally break three dishes, bang my head on the cabinet, my car has mechanical issues that will cost a lot to fix, and our well is leaking which will take a small fortune to repair, but at least I haven't broken a bone or at least my kids are all happy and healthy or at least I didn't spill my tea on myself. Some of those might seem like trivial things to find a glimmer of hope in, but it's those small things that remind me that life hasn't really fallen apart, even when it feels like so much is crashing around me. Those things still standing give me hope.

What period of time do you find yourself living in most – past, present, or future? Why do you spend your time living there? And how do you move yourself out of living in that time?

I tend to live in the future. I'm constantly looking forward and thinking about what I do now and how that will affect my future. My husband is always saying, "That's future Chris's problem" when I bring up how something may affect him later. Mainly I live in the future because I don't want to be stuck dealing with frustrating consequences in the future, it's so much easier to just deal with it now and be done with it. However, there are definitely times when it's better to not worry about all that and just live in the moment or to sit back and think about the past. A lot of times my husband and kids help me live in the moment telling me not to worry about it, it'll all be okay, or that's future Molly's problem and to not think about it right now, just enjoy. When I'm alone I have to very consciously tell myself to not worry, to not think about it, to just be. That is an incredibly hard thing to do and sometimes I am better at it than others. When it comes to looking toward the past, the best way for me is to look at old pictures, read past journal entries or poems, or look at keepsakes and sit in the memories they invoke which are sometimes good and sometimes bad. There are certainly things to learn from the past and hold on to, there are things to appreciate in the moment as I live it and keep a small piece of, and there are things to look forward to in the future in changes and growth. It's all something I have to remind myself of when I get stuck in any one place too long.




3. Bethel offering envelope

Council Members Present: President: Ron Foust; Vice President: Peggy Wick; Secretary: Cathy Houg; Treasurer: Jill Duncan; Financial Secretary: Stacy Meyer; Finance Board: Mitch Overbye and Sara Jepsen; Education Board: Pete Hallberg and Emily Koehler; Trustee Board: Bryon Weisenburger and Dave Gohl; Pastor Molly Wills **Call to Order:**

• The meeting was called to order at 6:00 by Pres. Ron Foust followed by an opening prayer led by Pr. Molly. **Council Business:**

- A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Peggy Wick to approve the agenda as presented with two additions under New Business. Motion carried.
- Pastor Molly has visited the members who are unable to attend Sunday worship. Confirmation will wrap-up on Sunday, May 12, 2024. She met with two Gideon representatives. The Council's general consensus is to invite them to present a temple talk during a Sunday morning worship. She attended a first-call meeting. The Bethel Funeral Handbook has been completed and will be distributed to families when needed.

Old Business:

 Two new kitchen stoves have been installed. A motion was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Pete Hallberg to pay the \$2089.95 (\$500 from WELCA and the remainder from Thrivent Choice) to HomeSource for the stoves. Motion carried.

New Business:

- Peggy Wick, Pastor Molly, Dave Gohl, and Pete Hallberg will serve on the committee to develop a Stewardship Campaign.
- The suggestion of a new pictorial directory was discussed. Someone will be needed to spearhead this project. Dave Gohl will contact Lifetouch/Shutterfly to see if they have a team that works with churches.
- Pastor Molly brought up the need of a credit or debit card for the church. Jill Duncan and the Finance Board will look into options.

Secretary Minutes:

A motion was made by Ron Foust and seconded by Emily Koehler to accept April's secretary's report.
 Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:

A motion was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Peggy Wick to accept April's treasurer's report.
 Motion carried.

Financial Secretary Report:

 A motion was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Sara Jepsen to accept April's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

Reports:

Education Board:

Work continues implementing the Child Protection policy. They are completing a schedule as to when awards and/or blessings be given to Sunday School students.

• Finance Board:

Nothing to discuss.

• Trustees:

Bryon Weisenburger presented a plan for a fund raising campaign in order to paint the bell tower. A **motion** was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Dave Gohl to contract with CertaPro Painters to paint the bell tower at the price of \$7980, and to go forward with scheduling the project and paying the downpayment. The Council, per Constitution, can spend up to \$5000, while continuing to receive donations to reach the \$8000 goal. Motion carried. The Trustees looked for damage in the Sunday School room because of water leaking in. They found no stains, mold, or mildew. The Spring Clean-up Chart has been posted. Birds building nests in the bell caused the bell not to ring. Issue has been mitigated.

Communications:

- Pastor Molly Wills will be out for Continuing Education May 13-16. Pastor Susan has agreed to be "on call".
- Sunday, June 9, 2024, Pastor Molly will be on vacation. Pastor Susan will provide pulpit supply.

The meeting closed with Round Table Prayers followed by the Lord's Prayer.

The next regular Council meeting will be held on Monday, June 10, 2024, at 6:00 p.m.
