FROM PASTOR MOLLY

Hello my Beloved Bethel members!

I decided to take a break from answering the Lenten questions to do a little explaining about my decision to do spiritual practices instead of a regular sermon. I have had some feedback and realized I never really explained it fully in one go. I know for some, the spiritual practices might be frustrating and certainly not feel like a normal "church" thing to do. After attending the Festival of Homiletics in May, in which the sessions were all about preaching and self-care within preaching, I felt moved to bring spiritual practices into the service as a form of self-care for all of us within our relationship with God.

It started as a spur of the moment holy experiment. Since then, I have decided to continue doing spiritual practices once a month during the service. It will not necessarily be the same Sunday of every month. There are various reasons for my decision to continue them. As a pastor, it is my job to encourage spiritual growth and connection with God. Not everyone is as good as others at listening to sermons or receiving the same fulfillment, connection with God, and spiritual instruction from them. I want people to have the chance to experience multiple different ways to connect with God spiritually rather than just through listening to a sermon so that their faith can also grow and flourish.

Life these days is incredibly chaotic, and the spiritual practices during the services are a way for all members to have an intentional moment of stillness, at least once a month, to be in a relationship with God, that they are possibly not able to get at home. I know how incredibly hard it can be to force myself to take a moment to just breathe, to just pray, to just be in the midst of all the things that need to get done every day with the house, the family, the job, life. So spiritual practices are a chance for everyone to make an intentional effort to just be with God. The church has always been good at leading by example in worship except when it comes to spiritual practices. I hope we can change that.

The older generations have had a solid, widespread church as a foundation for faith, and a solid faith community. Unfortunately, in today's generation large denominations such as Lutherans, Catholics, Baptists, etc., have dwindling numbers as younger people (and some older ones too) search for a spiritual connection that they aren't finding in church either because it simply isn't done, or the "church" has hurt them. By incorporating spiritual practices into our worship we will be able to help our congregants and anyone who visits us or worships online be able to experience a new or stronger connection with God.

I hope this letter helps explain my purpose a little more, and even if you have a very healthy, strong way of maintaining your faith, I encourage you all to open yourselves to trying the practices during church, just to give yourself a chance to see how the Holy Spirit might move you.

I know the art is one that makes people nervous. It is not something we will do every month or every other month because I know not everyone is as comfortable with drawing. It is not about the art at all, but about meditating on the scripture simply in a different way. But again, I know not everyone is comfortable with it. My goal is to do a different spiritual practice each month. It will eventually circle back around to the art, but I'm hoping to have a variety of practices because I know that each person connects with God in a different way. As time goes on, maybe you will find one that really helps you feel connected with God to incorporate at home within your life outside of church.

I will still be doing a sermon three or four times a month (depending on the number of Sundays in the month). If you don't wish to do whatever the spiritual practice is for a certain Sunday then I'd suggest either reading the Bible or sitting in prayer during that time - to use it intentionally to just be with God in a way that is more comfortable to you.

I welcome the chance to sit down and talk with anyone about this or anything else!




3. Bethel offering envelope

Council Members Present: President: Ron Foust; Vice President: Peggy Wick; Secretary: Cathy Houg; Financial Secretary: Stacy Meyer; Finance Board: Mitch Overbye and Sara Jepsen; Education Board: Pete Hallberg; Trustee Board: Bryon Weisenburger; Pastor Molly Wills

Call to Order:

 The meeting was called to order at 6:01 by President Ron Foust followed by an opening prayer led by Pastor Wills.

Council Business:

- A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Sara Jepsen to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.
- In the last month, Pastor Wills has visited the members who are shut-in. She attended a Homiletics Festival in Pittsburgh, PA, and also attended the Synod Assembly. Confirmation has ended by meeting with the confirmands' parents. Baccalaureate Service was held with all graduates in attendance.

Old Business:

- The Finance Board presented a church credit card policy, which would allow the church secretary access
 to efficient and alternative means of payment for approved expenses. A motion was made by Peggy Wick
 and seconded by Pete Hallberg to accept the Bethel Lutheran Church Credit Card Policy. Motion carried.
- Discussion about a photo directory was tabled until next month.

New Business:

- A motion was made by Bryon Weisenburger and seconded by Mitch Overbye to move July's Church Council Meeting date to July 15, 2024, at 6:00 p.m. Motion carried.
- President Foust requested that each Church Council member look over their particular job description (found in their binder) for any updates or additions that are needed to define their job. Last done in 2018, these updates will then be reviewed by the Executive Board for acceptance.

Secretary Minutes:

 A motion was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to accept May's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:

A motion was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Peggy Wick to accept May's treasurer's report.
 Motion carried.

Financial Secretary Report:

 A motion was made by Mitch Overbye and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to accept May's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

Reports:

Education Board:

The Education Board is discussing the dates of Vacation Bible School. Anyone who is working with or around children of the church needs to get a background check. Please contact Tamie Foust for information. This background check process will require a \$20 donation.

Finance Board:

A yearly check-in with Resplandor de Gloria has been completed. They are happy with the church's accommodations and their time slot. In the past month, the Finance Board has completed the church's credit card policy. (adopted under Old Business)

Trustees:

The Trustees will be in contact with CertaPro Painter to schedule a time to paint the bell tower. The goal of raising \$8000 has nearly been met. The mats and desk that were available are now gone.

Communications:

- We will again work at the Burger Stand for Prairie Days. A team of 6-8 people are needed for the 1-3 p.m. time slot on July 13, 2024. Peggy Wick will recruit and coordinate the team.
- This fall the Constitution and Bylaws will be reviewed by the Executive Board and Pastor Molly to see if any changes need to be considered. If so, the Board will report back to the Church Council, and the changes will then be presented to the congregation at the Congregational Annual Meeting.

The meeting closed with Round Table Prayers and the Lord's Prayer.

Children and Youth Volunteers

Bethel's Child and Youth Policy requires anyone volunteering with and around children to have a background check every five years. There is also an online Child and Safety Training requirement (approx. 30 minutes) to complete, and we are asking for a donation of \$20 to cover expenses.
