## FROM PASTOR MOLLY

Hello Beloved Children of God!

It's April already! And Easter is very late this year. During our Lenten season, we have been listening to other's faith journeys and introspectively thinking about our own faith journeys. Lent always seems like a solemn time, yet journeys through the wilderness aren't always necessarily full of danger, darkness, and pain. Lent is a time of hope, looking forward to the earth awakening from its long winter rest into the new growth of spring, looking forward to the news that Jesus is no longer in the tomb, but has arisen! So, let's take a moment to find some joy during this Lenten season. I have two stories that have stuck with me, even though they don't seem particularly important. I found them entertaining when I heard them, but the value they have for me isn't really in the stories themselves, it's in the memories of the storytellers, and how each has affected my life and my faith.

My first story: My husband and I like to take our kids on tent camping trips each summer. On one particular trip, our campsite was a little jaunt from the restroom building which was decent sized with about four individual stalls within each bathroom. We were starting to cook our dinner over the fire, and our oldest said he was going to make a trip to the bathroom. About 5 minutes later he came back and very excitedly started saying, "Oh man, guys, I gotta tell you this story!" At which point we all stopped what we were doing to look at him and hear what he had to say. He continued, "I went to the bathroom, and when I went in, there was a guy in there..." We all kept looking at him. The seconds ticked by and by, until I finally said, "Okay? And did something happen with the guy?" Our son gave us this look like we were crazy and had completely missed something very important. He said, "No, that was the story!" *<grin>* 

My second story: I was in college and went to visit my grandma, who was in her late 80's. She lived alone, in the country, on an old, no longer running farm. She and I were sitting in her kitchen at her round, oak table, enioving a hot mua of tea and eating kringla she'd pulled from her freezer. She had this habit of chewing on a toothpick after she'd eaten, and at the moment she had a toothpick sticking out of her pursed mouth. For the life of me I don't recall what we were talking about that led up to what she next told me, but this I'll always remember. As she played with the toothpick in her mouth and I munched on my kringla, she proceeded to say, "When I was a little girl we had to go to the bathroom outside in the outhouse. When I was, oh about 4 or 5, I'd say, I got it into my head to wonder what would happen if I put newspaper over the hole before I sat down and did my business. So, I found some newspaper and tried it." She paused, continuing to chew on her toothpick, the corners of her pursed mouth curling up into a tiny smile. I looked at her, probably with some horror and amusement on my face, and though I assumed I knew the answer asked, "What happened?" She gave a low, little chortle and then pulled the toothpick from her mouth and grinned at me, "Well of course the pee didn't go through the newspaper! It ran right off it and down my legs. It went right into my stockings and shoes. Oo, mother was not happy with me!" <qrin>

Take a moment to think about the memories you hold within your heart and ponder why those memories are so important and bring forth the feelings they do.

Driving Away Hunger is designed to reduce transportation and mobility issues associated with food access in our communities. The Mobile Outreach vehicle is stocked with shelfstable pantry items, fresh produce, frozen proteins, dairy, grains, and bakery treats. <u>STOP & SHOP THE BUS at no cost to</u> <u>you!</u> All sites are open to the public!

Orders must be placed prior to delivery dates and are prepacked during the winter months. A limited number of walkup portions will be available at each delivery site. The staff will accommodate anyone not able to safely enter the vehicle for shopping. The staff are not permitted to carry food inside a residence.

Full grocery distributions are available once (1X) per month, per household. One visit per week is allowed across all sites. Schedule changes are announced at

# Maundy Thursday Foot Washing

Walking in sandals on the roads of Israel in the first century made washing feet very important before a communal meal. People ate while reclining at low tables, so their feet were in plain sight. Usually, foot washing was the job of the lowest servants. However, during the Last Supper, Jesus performed this humble task by washing his disciples' feet (John 13:1-17). This act has special meaning in three ways.

- 1. For Jesus, it was a beautiful display of his humility and servanthood in forgiving sinners, setting an example for us all to follow.
- 2. For the disciples, having their feet washed showed a contrast to their own attitudes at the time.
- 3. For us, washing feet symbolizes how we should treat one another, reminding us of our roles in the body of Christ.

We encourage you to wear sandals (or regular shoes) on Maundy Thursday and participate in washing each other's feet as you arrive, followed by sharing an Agape Meal.

# <u>Maundy Thursday Agape Meal</u>


An Agape meal is a Christian gathering that emphasizes fellowship, community, and sharing. It is rooted in the communal meals of the early church and reflects the spirit of "agape," which signifies selfless, unconditional, and sacrificial love.







**Call To Order:** The meeting was called to order at 6:01 P.M. by President Dave Gohl followed with prayer by Pastor Molly Wills.

#### **Council Business:**

A **motion** was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to approve the agenda. Motion carried. A **motion** was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Jill Duncan to approve the secretary minutes from February. Motion carried.

#### Pastor Molly:

- Visited our homebound.

- Attended a meeting with the Lester Prairie Pastors.

#### Old Business:

- Trustees: Two new fire extinguishers have been installed at the stairway balcony. The parking lot gauge (mock-up) is in the Narthex. Streaming issue for the internet is in the works to resolve. The slide curtain is to be replaced with cork board. Solar panels for the church sign by the county road need attention for proper illumination. Tried to remedy the floor squeak on the altar at the podium.

- Easter Sunday worship service April 20<sup>th</sup> is at 9:00 A.M. with brunch to follow at 10:00 A.M. Sara Jepsen is chairperson for the brunch. Brunch is being served by the council. Free will offerings will be accepted.
