FROM PASTOR MOLLY

Hello Beloved Children of God!

At the beginning of Epiphany, on January 12th, I asked you all to talk with other people about the questions: Who is Christ to you? And how does Christ appear in your life? I've been told I ask some really hard questions, but that is a part of my job as a pastor. To make you think about your faith; to give you the chance to speak about your faith without fear of judgment so that you can fully understand your faith, how you live it out, and be able to speak about it with people in and beyond the church world.

Who Christ is to you and how you see Christ appear within your life all depends on your relationship with our Triune God. Maybe Christ is central to your relationship with our Triune God. Maybe, like with me, Christ is an aspect of the Triune God that validates and cements the relationship you have with the Holy Spirit and the Father/Mother. Maybe who Christ is to you is something completely different than those two possibilities. That is for you to figure out.

Here is my answer to who Christ is to me: I have never had a faith shaking experience, but I have had life-altering experiences, some that have shaken my world down to the core and made me feel like I was being ripped apart from the inside out, but God has always been there, and I have never doubted God's love for me and God's presence with me in the horrible and wonderful moments.

God has been my imaginary friend, who is really with me, since I was little. From as far back as I can remember, I will go outside and stand and just listen to the wind blow through the leaves and feel the Holy Spirit dancing in the air. I sing and I know the Holy Spirit lifts my voice up to the heavens, cradling it, singing with me. God speaks to me in my dreams. God listens to me even when I scream with rage at him, and at the rough stuff life throws at me.

I think the biggest difference Jesus and God make in my life is seeing how my relationship with God and my faith in God is different from others and how that has affected the way I approach life. I have never thought God caused bad things to happen to me. God takes my anger, when I'm hurting and don't know how to deal, but the anger has never been because I think God caused the pain. That is simply not the mindset I could ever have, because God is and has always been my closest friend. I think knowing that, gives me support in those really rough times and helps me not sink completely into a despair I can't come out of. God is with me, and God loves me, even when it might feel like the rest of the world is against me. And God coming in human form as Christ Jesus to live and experience all the happiness and harshness of life validates and cements the relationship I have had with God my entire life. I see Christ, God, appearing in my life within the people around me - in my husband, children, parents, siblings, friends, acquaintances, and strangers.

One VERY important thing to remember is that there is no wrong answer to who Christ is to you, nor to how Christ appears within your life. Each person will have a different answer because they have a different relationship with God, but no relationship with God is wrong. Above all, God wants to be in relationship with you, so long as you have a relationship with God, whatever, however it might be, that is all that matters!

Driving Away Hunger is designed to reduce transportation and mobility issues associated with food access in our communities. The Mobile Outreach vehicle is stocked with shelfstable pantry items, fresh produce, frozen proteins, dairy, grains, and bakery treats. STOP & SHOP THE BUS at no cost to you! All sites are open to the public!

Orders must be placed prior to delivery dates and are prepacked during the winter months. A limited number of walkup portions will be available at each delivery site. The staff will accommodate anyone not able to safely enter the vehicle for shopping. The staff are not permitted to carry food inside a residence.

Full grocery distributions are available once (1X) per month, per household. One visit per week is allowed across all sites. Schedule changes are announced at

Boxes of Sunshine









Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 6:05 pm by President Ron Foust followed by the Lord's Prayer.

Council Business:

- A motion was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Mitch Overbye to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.
- Pastor Molly's report was on-line as she is attending a First Call Retreat. During the last month she officiated at a rehearsal and wedding held at Bethel. She attended a Crow River Conference pastor's meeting, the Youth Task Force meeting and social, and the Great River Conference pastors' meeting. She visited the homebound bringing them communion. Advent Services were completed and the Christmas Eve service was well attended.

Old Business:

• The Finance Board has completed year-end consultations and budgetary salary discussions for all employees.

New Business:

- The 2025 budget proposal was presented by the Finance Board. A **motion** was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Dave Gohl to increase the CenterPoint Gas line item to \$3000. Motion carried.
- LuAnn Weisenburger and Julie Hanson will be the janitors for 2025, with each working every other month. A **motion** was made by Cathy Houg and seconded by Mitch Overbye to hire them as contract employees at a salary of \$62.50 per week. Motion carried.
- A **motion** was made by Pete Hallberg and seconded by Sara Jepsen to recommend the Endowment Report including approved grants and financials be presented at the Annual Meeting. Motion carried.
- The Audit Committee- Jenna Pariseau, Jeremy Radtke, and Nicole Kleve along with the Finance Board was requested to complete the 2024 Audit by the next Council meeting on February 10, 2025.
- Installation of new and current Church Council members will be on February 9, 2025, during the worship service.

Secretary Minutes:

• A **motion** was made by Bryon Weisenburger and seconded by Emily Koehler to accept December's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:

• A **motion** was made by Emily Koehler and seconded by Bryon Weisenburger to accept December's treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary Report:

• A **motion** was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Peggy Wick to accept December's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

Reports:

Education Board:

A second Sunday School teacher has volunteered to teach a 4th through 6th grade class every other Sunday alternating with Confirmation class. The second graders completed the God's Grace milestone class on January 12, 2025. They will be recognized during worship service on January 19, 2025.

• Finance Board:

The preliminary budget has been completed for 2025 and was earlier recommended by the Council to be presented at the 2025 Annual Meeting. Janitorial service for 2025 has been procured and accepted by the Council.

Trustees:

With the general consensus of the Council that we go forward with the project, a **motion** was made by Pete Hallberg and seconded by Peg Wick to add "redoing the parking lot" to the Annual Meeting's agenda for discussion and possibly a vote. Motion carried. The thermostats will be set at a constant 68 degrees during which time the Trustees will assess the impact that has on energy expense. The keyboard used for Contemporary Worship is being examined to correct the feedback issues.

Communications:


- On Sunday, January 19, 2025, Pastor Susan Engholm will be pulpit supply for Pastor Molly.
