Driving Away Hunger-MEFS Mobile Outreach

Driving Away Hunger is designed to reduce transportation and mobility issues associated with food access in our communities. The Mobile Outreach vehicle is stocked with shelfstable pantry items, fresh produce, frozen proteins, dairy, grains, and bakery treats. <u>STOP & SHOP THE BUS at no cost to</u> <u>you!</u> All sites are open to the public!

Orders must be placed prior to delivery dates and are prepacked during the winter months. A limited number of walkup portions will be available at each delivery site. The staff will accommodate anyone not able to safely enter the vehicle for shopping. The staff are not permitted to carry food inside a residence.

Full grocery distributions are available once (1X) per month, per household. One visit per week is allowed across all sites. Schedule changes are announced at

Items to bring each week:

<u>March 12:</u> One metal nail clipper (attached file optional), remove packaging

<u>March 19:</u> One sturdy new comb, remove packaging <u>March 26</u>: One adult-size toothbrush, in original packaging <u>April 2</u>: Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8-9 oz., any brand, in original packaging

April 9: One lightweight bath-size towel (between 20"x 40" and 52"x 27", dark color recommended

WELCA March Bible study



3. <u>Bethel offering envelope</u>





Call To Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:02 P.M. by President Dave Gohl followed with prayer by Pastor Molly Wills.

Council Business: A **motion** was made by Mitch Overbye and seconded by Stacy Meyer to approve the agenda and secretary minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Pastor Molly:

- Attended the First Call Retreat in January.
- Helped lead the Youth Task Force Social, hosted by Bethel, in January. The youth made 168 cards to give out.
- Visited the homebound.
- Led the Crow River Conference Pastors meeting February 4th at Bethel with a total of 10 pastors.
- Will attend the Crow River Conference Assembly February 23rd at 2:00 P.M. Bethel can send up to two representatives as well as the pastor, if they so choose. If anyone is interested in attending, please contact Pastor Molly.

Synod Update:

- There is one opening for Lutheran Men in Mission. This is a two-year term which meets four times per year. If any men are interested, they need to put their name forward before the Crow River Conf. Assembly on Feb. 23rd.
- Immigration was a topic.
- The news of Lutheran Services committing fraud is false. The Synod is trying to stay up to date on their website with information.
